Mission

 Deliver services of Federal Government cost-effectively to promote economic development with a focus on rural infrastructure development

Broad Authority

Allows flexibility to fill Market Gap for Social Good

Commission Special Tools :

- 1. Section 311 transfer authority
- 2. Non-federal cost share
- 3. No-year funds

- Important to consider total community needs
- Benefit of bundling, pairing funding and programs for increased efficiency, success
- Project Planning
 - Utilities and housing
 - Energy and housing
 - Workforce and housing
 - Continued...

Denali Commission Work Plan

- Energy
- Bulk Fuel
- Village Infrastructure Protection
- Transportation
- Water and Sanitation
- Health Facilities
- Housing, EcoDev, WorkDev, Broadband

Consider the Capital Stack

- Financing
 - Private or Public
- Federal grant funding
 - HUD, AHFC/State, BIA, USDA, Other
- Other financing
 - City, trust, foundation, sweat equity, IRT
- Phased approach to project development

Examples - FFY22 Grant (Housing)

- Rural CAP Hooper Bay TA
 - Ensuring homeowners access existing programs
- Ketchikan Housing Strategy
 - Affordable housing, implementation, funding
- Bethel Community Services Supportive Housing
 - 20-unit Housing First Supportive Housing, homelessness
- Inupiat Community of Arctic Slope
 - Arctic housing methodology for affordable, resilient housing
- TNHA (North Slope Housing Authority)
 - Point Lay affordable housing, three duplexes
- Village of Solomon, Nome Housing Development
 - Fill, utilities, and plot development

Examples - FFY23 Grant (Housing)

- Village of Solomon, Nome Housing Development
 - Vertical construction on new development
- Rural CAP Sweat Equity Program
 - Incorporates homeowner participation in construction
- Sitka Community Land Trust
 - Site development for Apartment, feeder to home ownership
- Kijik Corporation
 - Nondalton Community Infrastructure Plan
- TKC Fish Wheel
 - Sawmill factory, developing integrated rural home kits
 - Utilizing local timber, factory-built trusses
 - Champion to drive complex project

Materials Science for Construction

3D Printed Housing

- Utilizing local materials to print home
- Feasibility determined integrity of printed material
- Leverage HUD, City, University, IRT, NREL, AHFC

- University of Maine and Penn State
- U of Alaska receiving robot, exploring programming
 - Future Arctic Materials Science Center?

Merbok Housing Project Plan

- Coordinate statewide, local implementation
 - AHFC, AAHA, CCHRC/NREL, RurAL CAP, HAPPP, HUD
 - Alaska Lumber Mills
 - Regional HAs, Native Nonprofits, Tribes, CDQ
- Plan accordingly, then implement
 - Housing Depot Best Practices, AHFC
 - All Alaska Supply Chain, Partners
 - Local Use Provisions, NREL/CCHRC
 - Leverage, RurAL CAP

Overarching Housing Objective

- Problem is cost and availability of housing
- Strive to address structural challenges
 - Continue looking for cost savings
 - Continue partnering, leveraging existing programs

Champions Unlock Opportunity

- Find and pursue funding
 - Capital stacking, phased project approach
- Coordination with project partners
 - Technical providers must be included
- Coordination with community partners
- Consider regional and local needs
- Manage uncertainty and change

Responding to Uncertainty, Change

- No project deploys as planned
 - Good projects are close
 - Good project outcomes can include change
 - Project bundling
- Managed risks, planning, strong partners
 - It's not the strongest or most intelligent that survives; it's the one most adaptable to change.
